The Institute of the Black World (IBW) was founded in 1969 to help define, defend and support the black freedom struggle in the post-civil rights era. A national and international network of black scholars and intellectuals, artists and activists, it advised and provided intellectual, strategic and program support to organizations, institutions and individuals committed to empowering black people and advancing their interests. It also played a leading role in establishing Black Studies Programs nationally and updating the black educational, cultural and political agenda. It closed its doors in the mid-1980s, a casualty of government counter-intelligence disruptions and tampering with IBW's funding sources. Nonetheless, IBW continues to impact the founding of many social justice and community activist groups.
